#### News from Lake District Chairman Marlo Orth

Fred Poss, Lake Eau Claire Association President, invited me to write an article to be published in the Lake Association Newsletter. I welcome this opportunity because the more informed and involved everyone is, the better. What are most people interested in? What will it cost me and what will I get.

The responsibility of your District Commissioners is to carry out the directives of the electors and property owners as passed at the annual meeting.

Thanks to the Lake Association they have installed three sediment traps on the river. They got matching funds from both the DNR and Eau Claire County Lake Rehab Fund. One of the qualifications to get the DNR grant was to demonstrate the ability to maintain these traps. When we formed a Lake District, the DNR accepted this as qualifying. Recognizing this, the electors and property owners at the annual meeting in August passed a budget with a 1.5 mill levy which will appear on the tax bill we receive the end of December. Included in that budget was \$2400.00 for cleaning the traps in the creeks on the north side of lake. Also \$41,840 was included for cleaning the traps in the river in the future.

No one knows how much sediment will be transported in any given year. What we do know is that these traps are effective in keeping a lot of sand out of our lake. Well over 200 truck loads of sand has been removed from the three small traps on the creeks on the north side of the lake. This is material that did NOT get into our lake. We also know that the river contributes a great deal more. That is why people, at annual meeting, decided to prepare for the time when the river traps need to be cleaned by saving for the future. Because of the bed load already present in the river, we expect the first number of years to be the most costly for us to maintain the traps. The budget was based on a four-year estimate.

We are blessed to have a Lake Association with very dedicated leaders (who all donate their time). Rod Zika took the lead in developing a Lake Management Plan, which both the County and DNR accepted. Fred Poss, John Selz and other board members have been actively seeking donations. The annual Lake Eau Claire Association Clear Water Triathlon and Picnic along with other efforts have all raised money to improve our lake. Remember the more money we can raise this way, will reduce our tax levy in the future. I could name many others, as: they have volunteered and contributed hundreds of hours and dollars. Rod Zika is already working on an update to our Lake Management Plan to address water quality and the fishery in the headwaters of the river. A big thanks to all who worked and/or contributed.

We now know that the By-Laws as passed at the annual meeting are in conflict with State Statutes. When this happens State Statutes prevail. At issue is "who is eligible to vote". State law states that any U. S. citizen over 18 years of age and whose name appears as an owner of real property on the tax roll of the district is entitled to vote. This needs to be addressed at the next annual meeting and our by-laws brought into conformity with State Statutes.

We have a good start in our effort to improve our lake, but we have a lot more to do. By all of us working together we can do great things. Enclosed is a list of your Lake District board and how to contact them with your concerns and suggestions. Remember they can only do what is authorized at the annual meeting, and the next one is August 16, 2014

#### Make a Difference

Like all lakes, Lake Eau Claire has some issues threatening its continued existence. All lakes (especially those with inlets and outlets) suffer from siltation and nutrient buildup, or eutrophication. Eventually, all lakes and ponds will fill in and revert to the forest type typical of their geographical area. As human stewards of the environment, all we can do is to attempt to slow or reverse nature's processes. There are some things each of us can do to enhance and improve this resource.

We can reduce nutrient loading. Phosphorus is the primary culprit in causing severe algae blooms in lakes. Wisconsin has a ban on the use of phosphorus fertilizers for routine lawn fertilization. Make sure that the product you apply is free of this nutrient. Be aware of and supportive in a political sense of efforts to mitigate both point and non-point pollution sources affecting our lake.

My scoutmaster used to instruct us to "always leave your campsite a little cleaner than the way you found it." Keep that in mind when you visit our islands, shores, or below the dam. If everyone did this, these areas would eventually be as pristine as they deserve to be.

Practice "catch and release." Everyone enjoys a fish fry now and then, but our lake is under intense pressure as a fishery. Throw some back for the next kid who comes along.


