PRESIDENT'S PROGRESS REPORT

This summer, even with its late arrival, certainly has been a busy time for the work of the association. Our board members have all been engaged in assisting projects like the triathlon, which continues to be a method of community building for lake residents as well as a main source of revenue for the association. More fish cribs went into the lake on Saturday, June 22 as well. On the Lake Rehabilitation Project Front, we reconstituted the Budget and Finance Committee to consider and review the financial aspects of the spending for the dredging and aeration work. I have signed the contracts for the hydraulic dredging of Skid Row and the mechanical dredging of both the Gravel Pit and Troubled Waters Bridge areas. The dredging work will begin in early July, depending on the amount of rain and high water this summer keeps producing. I am also very pleased to report that key officers of the association like Rod Zika and John Selz have joined with me in securing significant donations from local organizations, local governments, and the Five Star Mine. These donated funds will be targeted toward providing extra money to the lake district government in order to help reduce the public costs for dredging.
