As summer quickly slips by and kids start heading back to school, it gives me pause to think of all the great things that happened on Lake Eau Claire over the past 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ months of 2017 and to be so thankful to all who continue to make Lake Eau Claire such a beautiful waterway.

Since our last newsletter (June) we successfully completed a few fundraisers that helped to generate some significant funds that we will be able to put to good use over the coming months. In June we held the 11th Annual Clearwater Triathlon and Fundraiser, in July we held the 3rd Annual Golf Fundraiser and also in July we held the first two successful gun raffles with the hopes of having more.

Other very important happenings were that the Association was able to clean out the Hay Creek sand trap. A total of 39 truck loads or over 387 cubic yards of sand was taken out. This is a big task and it couldn't have been done without the City of Augusta and the Town of Bridge Creek lending us the usage of their equipment. Thank you to them! We are now working to get the traps at Bed Post and Beach Creek cleaned out.

The Association is working closely with the Lake District to help in securing a new sand deposit site for future dredging needs. It is imperative we secure the site quickly as we will need it over the coming months. We had another successful fish crib building day and managed to install another 16 fish cribs. We've seen the positive effects this can have on fish population and we look forward to continuing this next year.

Wisconsin Lakes Partnership Update Submitted by Kristin Charlton

The Wisconsin Lakes Partnership gathered at UW-Stout August 2, 3 and 4th as part of their summer outreach meeting. This group includes statewide representatives from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, UW-Extension, and Wisconsin Lakes. It's a great chance to meet new people and see all the projects the DNR and UW-Extension are working on. The partnership also invites other stake holders that may be working on Wisconsin water issues.

The River Alliance and the Tainter Menomin Lake Improvement Association (TMLI) attended and gave presentations on their activities. TMLI was kind enough to host Partnership members on Tainter Lake for a Pontoon Tour.

Gina La Liberte, WDNR Blue-Green Algae Specialist did a training session on blue-green algae on Lake Tainter. Despite the rain, wind and cold it was a very valuable tour.

Dan Zerr, UW- Extension Regional Educator gave an update on the Eau Claire River Watershed Group. UW-Extension outreach with farmers has been ongoing with many successes. He reviewed the actions LEC has taken with the aeration system and dredging projects. The watershed work is critical to reducing the tremendous amounts of sand and chemicals coming into lakes Eau Claire and Altoona.

Carroll Schaal, DNR Section Chief discussed the Biennial Work Plan and an update on staffing changes and cuts within the agency not only in Madison but in all the regions. Some of the openings are due to retirements (Buzz Sorge and John Haack) and it's uncertain whether Madison will replace these positions. It appears that DNR educators will not be replaced anytime soon.

Eric Olson Director of UW Extension Lakes and Wisconsin Lakes Executive Director, Michael Engelson, also provided updates on the Lakes Convention and ongoing legislation.

The Red Cedar Conference will be held at UW-Stout on Thursday, March 8th, 2018. The theme for 2018 is "Land, Water and People Coming Together."

Boating & Personal Watercraft Rules & Reminders

It is that time of year when we see a lot of violations occurring on the lake. The below is a reminder of some of the rules and regulations. Please make sure you not only know these, but anyone in your household that may be operating a boat or PWC.

Age and Operator Restrictions

A person born on or after Jan. 1, 1989, and at least 16 years old may operate a motorboat only if he or she has completed a boating safety course accepted by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR)

A person who is at least 12 years old may operate a PWC only if he or she has completed a boating safety course accepted by Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.


Speed Restrictions

- It is unlawful to operate a motorboat at a speed that is greater than reasonable and prudent under the existing conditions. The speed shall be so controlled as to avoid colliding with any object, person or conveyance lawful in or on the water.
- It is unlawful to operate a motorboat within 100 feet of any dock, raft, pier, or buoyed restricted area on any lake at a speed in excess of "slow-no-wake".

Personal Watercraft (PWC) Law

1. No persons operate a PWC from sunset to sunrise.

 All persons riding a PWC must wear a PFD of the proper size and type (type I, II, III, or V).
 No one under 12 may operate a PWC. (Rental age limit is



16.)
4. Persons at least 12 but under 16 must be in possession of a valid boating safety student certificate (issued under s. 30.74(1)) to operate a PWC. (Parental supervision is not a substitute for a boating safety certificate as with other motorboats. PWC operators must have a certificate.)

5. It is illegal to operate a PWC facing backwards

6. There is no towing of persons engaged in water skiing, aquaplaning, or similar activities unless the PWC is designed to seat 3 people.

Most Common Boating Violations

1. Failure to provide proper number of personal flotation devices.

2. Operating boat without valid certificate of number,

3. Operating boat in prohibited area, in excess of speed limit on lakes 50 acres or less, or in excess of fixed limits.

4. Personal Watercraft violations.

5. Operating motorboat while under the influence of an intoxicant, or operating motorboat with BAC of 0.1% or greater.

6. Operating within 100 feet of dock, raft, pier, etc.

7. Operating boat at night without required lights.

8. Failure to display registration number or decal on boat.

What is Wisconsin Lakes?

Formed more than 20 years ago following the merger of the Wisconsin Federation of Lakes (the statewide association of lake associations) and the Wisconsin Association of Lake Districts Wisconsin Lakes works to develop statewide solutions for the challenges faced by our lakes while supporting strong local protection efforts. Our work has centered on legislative advocacy for strong statewide policy on clean water and lake sustainability for future generations, as well as a robust education and technical assistance programs for citizens, lake organizations, government officials, and others.

We can all agree our lakes are a precious natural resource and one of Wisconsin's top attractions. And, with the recent sunset of a long-term contract with the DNR to provide broad technical assistance, Wisconsin Lakes is now entering a new phase of Lake Advocacy and protection.

Off the Pavement – *by Dale Zank*



Another way to enjoy the great Eau Claire River Valley is Geocaching! Geocaching is a great way to explore, by looking for hidden caches on many of the trails in the area and some of the islands on Lake Eau Claire. It is like a small treasure hunt

There are over 2,000,000 geocaches worldwide, over a 1,000 in the Chippewa Valley, and close to 20 on Lake Eau Claire. These caches can be as small as a pill bottle or as large as an ammo box. They are hidden in trees, under logs, and other nooks and crannies in the woods (and in the city).

You will need to access a geocache app for your phone. I use Geocaching.com, or you can make a list of locations off of your computer and use a GPS unit to find the location. Each geocache location has its own latitude/longitude coordinates. This will normally get you within 10 feet of the geocache and then you will need to do some searching.

Once you locate the geocache you will find a notebook inside where you can write your user name (I use Zman for example) and the date you found it. Inside the box you will also find many trinkets. If you like one you can take one as long as you leave another trinket in exchange. You can also purchase a traveling medallion. This you place in a box and other people move it from location to location. If they move it they enter the medallion number on the website so that you can track how far it traveled.

There are also many geocaching themes. I am working on the Battleship theme. This entails finding all the caches in this group. Some of the caches will have a "hit" and you play it like the board game until you sink that battleship. Other themes may be musical and you will need to find a list of songs by Neil Diamond or albums by the Beatles. Many of these you need to find the first cache to get the coordinates for the second, and then the third and so on. Others are traveling geocaches. These lead you on a road trip around a certain area.

Just another reason to get out and enjoy this great Eau Claire River Valley we call home.

Note: Anyone wishing to try geocaching and do not know where to start, give me a call. I would be happy to go on a geocache hunt with you!

THE FISHIN' HOLE REPORT -by Fred Poss-

There is good news about the fishing situation on Lake Eau Claire. I happened to stop by Lake Holcombe and Lake Menomin a few days back, and the waters at both spots looked like green soup and had that familiar stink associated with blue green algae. Then I compared those waters to our lake. Wow!—what a difference. Yes, we have some floating weed that commonly appears on the surface in midsummer. But our water is clear and clean, and we can thank our aeration system for that!

A question that pops up occasionally is: **Why aren't the aerators placed in the shallow water toward the east end of the lake?** The short answer is that the shallow end already has enough oxygen in it from the river, and that blue green algae cannot grow in oxygenated water. It is the west end of the lake that requires the aerators which bubble oxygen into the deep water there which lack oxygen and therefore can grow blue green algae. An ounce of prevention is worth ten pounds of cure.

Another item of recent discussion is the improved fishing in our lake. The DNR recently stated that our lake has the largest population of walleyes per acre of any lake in Wisconsin. I think we should take real pride in that fact. A big vote of appreciation has to go out to all the volunteers who respond to my calls for help building and installing fish cribs. Saturday, July 8, we installed another 16 cribs, making our total rise to 283 plus 88 tree drops. That makes a grand total of 371 fish producing structures, and makes reaching our goal of 500 structures by 2020 very realistic. It also needs to be said that these structures do decay over time, so that we hope to adjust our schedule and amount of cribs going into the lake to allow for some loss.

Please keep responding to my call for helpers when another fish crib installation event is scheduled!

Finally, our Association did coordinate with the Lake District for the cleaning out of Hay Creek this summer. Unfortunately, because of all the high water events, that trap is full again. The issue of what to do about Hay Creek and Muskrat Creek will have to be addressed by voters at the August annual meeting of the Lake District. We also hope to clean out Bed Post and Beach Creek if we can coordinate with local government assistance.
