PRESIDENT'S NOTE





Over the past week, many of us have noticed the green algae that has formed on our lake. I have received numerous calls, text messages, and emails about this problem. I am sorry to say there are no quick or easy remedies to this situation once it appears. We have been extremely lucky over the past several years because we have not seen this problem while many lakes around us have. Algae will typically form when the water is warm and enriched with nutrients like phosphorus or nitrogen. Some of the best things we can do for our lake is:

- Use lawn fertilizers only when truly necessary
- Prevent yard debris from washing into storm drains
- Plant and maintain vegetative buffers along shorelines
- Continue to run the aeration system which increases the oxygen in the water and encourages the growth of beneficial bacteria that can consume the excess nutrients

While I know this situation is very frustrating to all of us, let's remain positive! We have not seen conditions like this in many years. Years ago, I recall this situation recurring each year so we must be reminded of the progress we've made and keep up the good work. We cannot control Mother Nature but we can control the items listed above.

Why do we have a lake aeration system on Lake Eau Claire? What benefits are we seeing with the aeration system?

The Lake Association and the Lake District have heard these questions before and would like to offer the below as a bit more detail on the system that was installed a number of years ago, with the DNR's monetary help.



Oxygen serves as the most essential component to the health of a body of water. Lake aeration is the simple, yet effective, process of increasing oxygen levels in a lake and can not only greatly enhance the aesthetic beauty of a lake, but can also improve the natural systems taking place beneath the water's surface. The main purpose of aeration is to increase and stabilize the amount of dissolved oxygen in the entire water column and this has a widespread effect on many different aspects of pond and lake health.

The Six Main Benefits of Lake Aeration are:

1. Improves Water Quality

Under oxygen-deprived conditions, bottom sediments release nutrients that cause algae blooms, noxious gases and metals that can cause water quality problems. Proper aeration allows for many of the factors contributing to poor water quality to be mitigated.

2. Reduces the Likelihood of Excessive Algae Growth

The oxygen that is added to the lake through aeration facilitates the conversion of phosphorus to forms that are not usable by algae as food. Aeration can also effectively mix algae spores towards deeper parts of the lake, meaning it will have less available sunlight and time to grow.

3. Removes Foul Odors

As bottom water mixes and becomes oxygenated through aeration, the hydrogen sulfide gas that causes foul odors will be greatly reduced.

4. Enhances Fish Habitat

Stratification occurs when sunlight and air temperatures warm the surface water and create a layer of water of lower density. The resulting thermal stratification results in oxygen depletion over time, which will cause an overall decline in the health of the ecosystem and, in severe cases, may lead to fish and other aerobic organism death. By disrupting stratification through aeration, a healthier habitat will be created for fish and other aquatic organisms.

5. Decreases Mosquito Activity

Mosquitoes require still water conditions for their eggs to develop. A floating fountain or submersed aerator will create a constant flow of water in the lake, helping to reduce viable mosquito breeding habitat and acting as a natural and sustainable mosquito control solution.

6. Reduces the Accumulation of Bottom Sediment

Organic matter decomposes much more slowly under low oxygen conditions, and this leads to buildup of unhealthy bottom sediment in the lake. Proper aeration will help to reduce the overall accumulation of organic sediment on the bottom of the lake. This, in turn, will lead to the development of a healthy ecosystem comprised of various aerobic organisms that provide bountiful food sources for fish.

What benefits have already been recognized from the aeration system on Lake Eau Claire:

- Oxygen levels have increased dramatically in the deepest areas of the lake. In 2016-2017, in cooperation with
 the Wildland School, we tagged walleyes with radio transmitters in the spring and followed their movements for
 over a year. We are happy to report that over half of the tagged fish reside mainly in the deepest waters of the
 aeration zone. Prior to aeration, fish could not survive in the deep waters. This means, because of the aeration
 system, the fish habitat has been greatly expanded.
- Water quality has greatly improved. Since aeration, algae blooms have been far less intense and in shorter.
- Enhancing fish habitats in a recent DNR study on Lake Eau Claire, the walleye population has increased from 2.5 walleye per acre to 5.3 walleyes per acre. The DNR now states that Lake Eau Claire is one of the best walleye lakes in the State of Wisconsin.

Please be assured that the association researched scientific data and consulted many experts and companies across America when selecting the aeration system we installed. Our system uses millions of tiny bubbles shot out of the aerators under high pressure to not only add oxygen to our lake, but also to disrupt the lake's thermocline. Every lake of even modest depth develops three levels of water: a top level that has warmth and oxygen, a bottom level that is cold and without oxygen, and a thermocline level in the middle which separates the other two. By disrupting the thermocline, our aeration system mixes oxygen into the deepest parts of the lake and helps limit or prevent the bacteria called blue-green algae from growing.

In summary, the aeration system is having success on Lake Eau Claire. Our lake was definitely lacking oxygen levels in deeper water. The system has corrected this issue and we have seen the results in greater fish population, less frequent algae bloom, less frequent beach closings, and better water clarity. If we were to decide to turn off the aeration system, we would likely be required to pay back the matching funds that were received from the DNR for this project. By doing so, it could also limit our chances at receiving future matching funds on upcoming projects like sand trap installations at Hay Creek and Muskrat Creek.

CLEAN CREEKS, CLEAN LAKE

On June 12, using five dump trucks from local governments and an excavator from an area dredging company, the LECA was able to arrange and fund the cleaning out of the Hay Creek Sand Trap. The local governments who agreed to provide dump trucks without charge were the Town of Bridge Creek, the Town of Ludington, the City of Augusta, and Eau Claire County. A thank you letter was sent to each of these governments to express our gratitude for their willingness to help carry the load to protect and improve Lake Eau Claire.

A total of 53 truckloads of sediment were removed from the present trap at the mouth/delta of Hay Creek where it joins our lake. Based on the carrying capacities of the various trucks, a total of approximately 575 cubic yards of sediment were removed and taken to our approved deposit site. This work by your association, in cooperation with the Lake District, stopped 53 truckloads of sediment from filling into the lake. This same arrangement has

proved to be successful in cleaning out two other small north side creeks, Bedpost and Beach Creeks.

For those who feel that the lake should be receiving help from other governments, the cleaning out of the three north side creek sand traps is an example of how we are doing building that partnership. The only cost is for the excavator, and since the lake association is a private organization, no Lake District tax levy public dollars are used.

If this private partnership type work is something you approve of, then please realize how critical it is for you to **join** the lake association, **come** to the June Triathlon, **enter** the July Golf Tournament, **attend** the winter holiday party, **sell** raffle tickets, and **enjoy** the fun of the winter ice-fishing contest.



Finally, we continue to partner with the Lake District in its effort to create a new sand traps on the various streams. This ongoing partnership is critical to our ongoing efforts to reduce sediment flowing into our lake. Stay tuned for more information on this!




