What is a Rain Garden?

By definition, a rain garden is a shallow depression that is planted with deep-rooted native plants and grasses. The garden should be positioned near a runoff source like a downspout, driveway or sump pump to capture rainwater runoff and stop the water from reaching the sewer system.

But rain gardens are much more than their physical and biological structure.


By installing a rain garden on your property or even using the principles of a rain garden in your landscaping, you can greatly increase your contribution to preserving clean rainwater, creating habitat and preventing local flooding and water pollution.



Preserving clean rainwater

On the next rainy day look out the window or even better, get an umbrella and go outside and look at the movement of the rainwater that falls on your property. Look at the flow of the water, where it pools and where it flows off your property to the sewer or local rivers.

By collecting that clean rainwater in your rain garden's shallow depression, you will make a contribution



Diverting large quantities of stormwater after our ever-larger rainfalls to a safe location and not into your basement can help to reduce potential home flooding. If your area encounters a dry or drought situation your garden will support itself. The deep roots of the plants will reach down toward the water in the soil that is not near the surface.

Creating habitat

One of the three requirements for a properly installed rain garden is the use of deep-rooted plants that are native to your area. Native plants are adapted to the local soil, climate and wildlife. They often are sturdy, colorful to attract insects to their nectar and birds to their seeds. But planting native plants in any form you will help to improve the survival of bees, butterflies and local and migrating birds.

By working to increase these beneficial insects and birds you can also naturally eliminate insect pests such as mosquitoes. When it comes to mosquito control rain garden are a natural and proven way to remove standing water and reduce mosquito breeding areas. By moving water downward into the ground through the deep roots of native plants, the plant's uptake of water and their transpiration or evaporation of the water.


Prevent local flooding and pollution

Rain gardens are a form of "bioretention" system. You can see large version of these systems in the parking lots of nature centers and state parks. These human-made systems temporarily store rainwater and runoff and clean the water of hydrocarbons, oil, heavy metals, phosphorous, fertilizers and other pollutants that would normally find their way to the sewer and perhaps our rivers and waterways.

Localized rain gardens do much the same thing. Relatively clean rainwater might flow across your roof, driveway or chemically treated lawn and pick up pollutants. Instead of moving these pollutants to the street the rain garden will intercept and naturally clean and infiltrate the water. In some area this reduces large quantities of water and contaminants from reaching the treatment plant and in others locals it prevents stormwater from running directly into rivers and streams.

Other benefits include:

Reduce or eliminate the need to water with municipal water Reduce garden maintenance Increase garden enjoyment Sustainability and urban enhancement Enhance sidewalk appeal

Update from Marlo Orth

Great news to share with everyone. On Monday, January 21, 2019 Haas Sons Inc. started on the NEW Hay Creek sediment trap. They were the low bid at \$7.11 a cubic yard. Eau Claire County constructed a road from County NL to Hay Creek sediment trap and another road from County NL to deposit site. The only thing we paid for on the two roads was for a mat and crushed rock to stabilize the road bed on a hill accessing Hay Creek trap. The Hay Creek trap is about 450 feet long. The bank of the creek needed to be cleared and prepared so the excavator can operate. The bid for this is \$3,000. In addition, we had engineering expense of \$11,206.

Many thanks to the Lake Association for paying for most of the expenses associated with construction of this new trap on Hay Creek, so be sure to support the Lake Association when they hold fund raisers, raffles, etc. as they continue to do projects to protect and improve our lake. (Please know the Lake District did not have the revenue to do this project.)

Currently Troubled Waters Bridge Trap (TWBT) is being cleaned by Krueger. This is the fifth time as we have had to do it every year. This is the first year Gravel Pit Trap (GPT) is not full enough to require cleaning. What this demonstrates is that our system of a series of traps is working. Depending on the number and severity of high-water flood events, it determines how often we need to clean the traps.

The Eau Claire River Watershed group is working to educate farmers of the advantage of using no-till and cover crops to reduce water, nutrients and sediment run off, thereby increasing their bottom line, and lesson Eau Claire River flood events. Eau Claire County is getting a \$248,000 grant and Clark County is getting a \$171,000 grant for this project.

Many thanks to Eau Claire County, DNR and the many volunteers working together. You are making a difference.

Drillin' Down! By Fred "Splash" Poss

Saturday morning, February 2, is a date for your calendar! It will be time for the next Lake Eau Claire Ice Fishing Contest. And speaking of ice fishing...just a couple of reminders to keep you safe when "Drillin' Down" season begins for you. Thickness is important. Three inches is generally considered the minimum depth for walking around on a frozen pond. Twelve to fifteen inches is thought of the minimum depth of ice for driving vehicles. But here is the thing: Ponds and lakes do not freeze evenly. Just because you can walk on the ice by the boat landing doesn't mean the lake is safe all the way around.

You may ask: How do I know? The answer is I had a friend who ignored this advice. He broke through in the middle of a big farm pond, and I went in to save him. The problem for me was he was twice my size. The long and short of it was that I was able to push him up on enough ice to keep him above water. A farmer came and rescued him.

But I didn't make it. The Rice Lake Fire Department arrived later to pull me out and apply a jump start. I still remember waking up in the ER and spending several hours watching ice come out every time I breathed. That is what happens when your body temp drops far below what it needs to stay alive.

So, if you ever hear my wife use her favorite name for me, you will understand why she still calls me "Splash!" Please make sure I am the only one who retains that nickname the next time you head out to do some "Drillin' Down."
