Winter has arrived on Lake Eau Claire! Fall seemed to slip by quickly and it sure seems like we had ice on the lake early this year. Now as I look outside, it is a Winter Wonderland with quite a bit of snow already!

As I reflect on our accomplishments in 2019, I'm pleased with the progress we keep making. We had excellent fundraisers which have resulted in profits of approximately \$39k, we distributed \$40k to the Lake District for the soon to be installed Muskrat Creek trap, we paid off the aeration land contract, we assisted the District in removing sand from our lake, and we continued efforts on continuing to improve our fisheries and water quality. None of these accomplishments could have taken place without the help from all of our volunteers and our excellent partners from the DNR, Eau Claire County, Town of Bridge Creek, Town of Ludington, and City of Augusta.

As we move into 2020, we have some big goals! First, we will have a new sand trap on Muskrat Creek and have big hopes for that section of our lake. We want to stabilize the banks along the river so that less sand will flow in. We are in process of finalizing our lake management plan so that we can apply for additional state grants. We would love to commit some funds to a new trap above the Skid Row boat landing. We are working on applying for some state funds to assist us in cleaning out/dredging the area in front of Skid Row to make it navigable again.

There is still so much to do and I can't wait to see what we accomplish in 2020. I want to personally say a huge Thank You to the Friends of Lake Eau Claire board of directors. I couldn't do this job without them. So many hours are put into all that we do and I really can't thank them enough. Thank You to every single volunteer we had in 2019! Your assistance does not go unnoticed! Thank You to all of our Excellent Business Sponsors! Your support means so much!

As we finalize the last couple weeks of 2019, I want to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! I hope to see you all out on the lake very soon.







Nature Notes

Once again, in this summer of 2019, nature watchers of Lake Eau Claire have been

blessed with a wealth of avian visitors to our lake. Loons and cormorants have come and gone as they pass through on their migration north. On the weekend of the fourth, I saw a flock of what I believed to be common terns, about a dozen or so, coursing up and down the lake, occasionally swooping down to pick up a bit of food from the water's surface. A few days later, they appeared to have moved on. Kingfishers, eagles, vultures and great blue herons can be seen daily. One visitor that I was told stopped by, but that I missed, was the white pelican.



Once only rarely seen in Wisconsin, these birds have become a regular, if only temporary visitor each summer. Nearly decimated by overkilling by fishermen, and the ravages of DDT (which was banned in 1972), these birds have made a great comeback in numbers. At one time down to an estimated 10,000 individuals, they are now estimated to number about 180,000. Formerly nesting mostly in the Dakotas and Canada, several breeding populations have now become established at Horicon Marsh, along the Mississippi, and in the vicinity of Green Bay here in Wisconsin. They are migratory, and winter along the Gulf Coast. These large birds (unlike herons) nest on the ground, and require areas away from human disturbance and excessive numbers of predators. Pelicans normally lay about 3 eggs, which they incubate with their feet, since they lack a brood patch.

The white pelican is a spectacular bird, with a wingspan of 8-9 feet and may weigh as much as 30 lbs. They have black wing tips and often soar seemingly effortlessly if wind conditions are right. They may live to be 30 years old. Unlike their cousin the brown pelican, they do not plunge from the sky into the water to catch fish, but rather use their pouched beak as a kind of seine, hunting either alone or in a circular "pod" of several birds that cooperate in forcing fish to their center. They consume mostly minnows and other small fish, taking prey up to about half the length of their bill. They are opportunistic and may sometimes take insects, amphibians, turtles, and even small birds or mammals. Prey is swallowed whole, and then later regurgitated to feed their chicks.

So far, these birds have only been observed as "visitors" to our lake. One might speculate that as fishing on Lake Eau Claire continues to improve, that we might see more of these spectacular birds in the future. Change in nature is always fascinating to

observe, and, who knows, we may even see a nesting colony established at some time in the future.



Lake District Update by Mike Lea

There has been a lot happening on the lake since my last update. The biggest news is the progress made on the Muskrat Creek trap project. The site has been engineered and a new road has been built to access the trap area. A bid

opening was held in mid-November and a contractor was selected out of the four bids received. The successful bidder was Krueger Stienfest Inc. from Antigo, WI who we have worked with in the past on the Troubled Waters and gravel pit traps with excellent results. It is planned to have this new trap completed by the end of the year.

All the other traps are full and in need of cleaning out this winter. Haas and Sons Excavating is planning to clean out the Hay Creek trap in the first half of December and Krueger Stienfest will be cleaning out the two river traps as soon as possible. Fred Poss is working on coordinating the north side creeks for dredging this winter and we are planning to add a layer of rock to the ramps at these traps to allow more reliable access for the dump trucks and dredging equipment.

Not all our projects are dredging related. We are in the process of planning some bank stabilization projects upstream from the lake in the hopes of reducing the amount of dredging that needs to be done in the future. Two potential areas are the bank in Lost Lake that is eroding and depositing sand in the Rookery and the large bank located just below the gravel pit trap. There may be some grant money available for these projects which the county will be pursuing. We are also in the process of working on the update to our Lake Management Plan so we can apply for other grants for various lake projects.




