First Winter on the Lake

This is my first winter season as a full-time dweller on Lake Eau Claire. Since our family moved into our cabin in Early November, I find myself, each morning, drawing back the curtains and curiously watching as the lake prepares for winter.

The parade of trolling fishing boats, swirling jet skis, cruising pontoons, and speed boats have all gone. The trailing waves of the water skier, like knife cuts in the lake surface, are now absent. The ripples and splashes of swimming children, clad in orange arm floats, have been replaced by the cold, stillness of the ice. Sometimes clear and diamond flat, other times marred, opaque, and wrinkled like a great sheet, the new ice layer creates ever changing vistas. Sometimes gently, sometimes violently, the lake water is molded and altered by temperature, time, and pressure.

Looking down to the shoreline, where the aged oak tree stands like a wise old man in the twilight of his life, his knobby arthritic limbs stretched out to cradle the squirrels and the birds, I think to myself: how many times has it seen this seasonal change?

On mornings like this, an eagle sometimes perches at the top of that old tree. Is he surveying his kingdom? Does he notice the daily changes in the face of the lake? Does he hear the haunting, underwater song that the lake makes as it breathes and groans and echoes with forming ice. Maybe that eagle is merely part of the process, a participant, not an observer like me. Even if he had the capacity, that eagle certainly has some serious responsibilities, and doesn't have the time to to reflect on these sorts of things. So, I will count myself lucky to have these free moments to observe the beauty of Lake Eau Claire, as it draws back into itself and prepares to rest.

Muskrat Project

As you know, the Lake Eau Claire Association donated \$40,000 to the Lake District in 2019 to dredge and install a brand-new sand trap on Muskrat. Since the installation (approximately 1 year ago), the trap has already started making some huge changes on the creek. After assessing the situation recently with the dredger and speaking to a couple of homeowners, the creek has already started to deepen and clear itself of some sand. The long-term goal is that it will continue to push the sand out all the way to the lake and restore the area in front of the cottages to what they once were.

Now some exciting news! To help speed up this process, the Lake Association has committed to donate additional funds to have the dredger come back and clean out in front of some of the cottages closest to the trap. By removing the sediment in front of those cottages closest to the new trap, we believe it will help to keep clearing out the sand further down the creek. This honestly just advances the process.

Mike Lea met with the dredger and the dredger indicated it can be done and he believes he could remove anywhere from 2500 to 4000 yards of sand. We have a little work to do by putting in a road and clearing the bank but we feel this is a really great project. The overall costs to the project will range from \$18,000 - \$27,000 depending on the amount of sand removed.

Now the tough part, we need to find money to fund this project. The Lake Association board has voted and is matching funds collected towards this project, up to \$14,000. We've had a number of individuals donate towards this project even though they don't live on Muskrat because they know how important the area is and affects our entire lake. Would you be willing to donate towards this project? Remember, donations are tax deductible!

Please remember that the Association's long-term goal is to keep Lake Eau Claire clear and to restore its levels to what they once were. After this project on Muskrat is complete, we are setting our sights on Skid Row and helping to restore that waterway.

A SIGN OF HISTORY

Hey there! Have you ever thought about being able to contribute to a lasting piece of history? Well, if our approval process is successful, you will have your chance. Dale Zank, Randal Stutzman and I are in the middle of applying for permission to create an historical sign placed at the entrance to the Lake Eau Claire County Park that commemorates the building of the Lake Eau Claire dam. The dam was completed in 1937 as part of a multitude of WPA (Works Progress Administration) state building projects. Beginning in 1935, WPA was established as part of the federal government's effort to jump start the staggering unemployment problems caused by the Great Depression of the 1930's. It should be noted that among hundreds of Wisconsin WPA projects, the dam on our lake was the single largest project in the state. It formed a lake of about 1250 acres to provide flood control and an important source of recreation. Furthermore, we are open to receiving any historical information you may have that can be added to our proposal or to the actual wording of the sign. As our research continues, we hope to complete the application process in the next month. At that time, we will begin asking for donations to purchase materials and pay the application fee. Should you have any historical facts or news regarding the Lake Eau Claire dam project, we would love to include whatever you can provide. Nature Notes

Viruses

Today, as I write this, the first vaccines for Covid-19 are being administered in the U.S. We are almost a year into this pandemic now, and this milestone, hopefully, creates some more light at the end of what has been a long tunnel indeed. Also today, the death toll from this catastrophe will exceed 300,000 of our fellow citizens, more Americans than were lost to combat in all the years of WWII. The culprit, we know, is a submicroscopic infectious agent known as SARS-CoV-2; a virus. A virus is a biological entity at the boundary of the living and nonliving. They are so tiny that it took the electron microscope to see them, and that came along in the 1930's.

There are thousands of species of viruses known to exist on earth, and they are found in all environments in incredible numbers. A virus is not cellular. It consists of a nucleic acid; either DNA or RNA, surrounded by a coat of protein called a capsid. They are not considered to be alive, as they don't breathe, eat, excrete wastes, or grow. What they do, however, is reproduce. They do so by attacking a certain type of cell called a target cell, and then they invade the cell and use the biochemicals of the cell to make many more virus particles, which then leave the cell and find other target cells to invade, destroying the cells in the process. If a sufficient number of cells are destroyed, death may result. If the target cell they seek is found in humans, that is when they become a problem for us.

There are known to be over 200 diseases of humans that are caused by viruses. Rabies, for example is caused by a virus whose target cells are nerve cells, and is spread from animal to human in the saliva from a bite of a rabid animal. It is close to 100% fatal. HIV, the AIDS virus, attacks a particular type of white blood cell, thus weakening the victim's immune system. Hepatitis viruses attack the cells of the liver. The virus of Covid-19 attacks the cells of the nasal passages, the lungs, and the lining of the intestine. Death is usually due to respiratory failure. The mortality rate for this disease in the US has proven to be about 1.8%, according to Johns Hopkins coronavirus resource center. That doesn't sound like a high death rate, but when you have many millions of people infected, it adds up to a frightening total.

Epidemiologists and futurists have often speculated that it might be virus that could emerge and drastically reduce human numbers on this planet. This pandemic should be seen as a wake-up call. A warning. Our confused and chaotic response to this crisis will not serve us well if another virus emerges seemingly out of nowhere, but has a mortality rate that is much higher than this one.







THE NORTHSIDE CREEKS ARE CLEANED OUT!

The cleaning out process on the Lake Eau Claire northside creeks was recently completed again. Thank you to the great intergovernmental and private business cooperation and volunteerism which allows our lake district and lake association to continue to protect and improve Lake Eau Claire. Seven haul trucks in total were donated for the work: one from the City of Augusta, two from the Town of Bridge Creek, one from the Town of Ludington, one from Eau Claire County, one from Barka Trucking and one from J&J Trucking and Dredging. Because of the donated trucks and labor of the drivers, we were able to save approximately \$4,700. Twenty truckloads of sediment were removed from each sand trap today for an approximate grand total of 370 cubic yards. Tollefson Dredging did the trackhoe work and exercised great care to avoid loading water with the sediment to avoid making County ND wet. Furthermore, Eau Claire County had a dump truck lay down road sand at each of the two trap sites to make sure there were no problems. A sincere thank you on behalf of The Friends of Lake Eau Claire, and The Lake Eau Claire Protection and Rehabilitation District, goes out to all those who provided assistance with this project. Pandemic Tax Tip: Non-Itemizers Can Deduct \$300 for Charity Donations in 2020

The tax break, part of the CARES Act, applies to cash given to charities by Dec. 31



In 2020, taxpayers who claim the standard deduction also have a chance to deduct charitable donations. The <u>Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act</u> gives taxpayers who take the standard deduction the ability to take an additional above-the-line \$300 federal income tax deduction for qualified charitable contributions. ("Above-the-line" means that the deduction is above line 15 on the 2020 1040 tax form, and will reduce both your adjusted gross income and your taxable income — which, in turn, reduces the amount of federal income tax you owe.)
