Another beautiful Wisconsin summer is in its final weeks and I'm happy to report, amazingly clear water! All the great things we are doing to the lake is having a significant impact on our clear efforts. water

Thank you to everyone that attended both the Lake Eau Claire District meeting and the Friends of Lake Eau Claire Annual Meeting on August 15<sup>th</sup>. This was a strange year as attendance was low and we did not hold our annual picnic prior to the meeting. Hopefully like will get back to a "new" normal soon and next year we can resume our social event.

A few summary points that I presented at our meeting:

- Our fundraising efforts have been slightly limited this year because we did not solicit some prior business sponsors, mostly bars & restaurants. The COVID situation has taken a toll on a lot of local business. I am very happy to report that our calendar sales profits were similar to last year and we profited over \$8,000. Our golf outing also had a great turnout and raised over \$5,000.
- We worked with the Lake District to update our Lake Management Plan and it has been approved by the DNR.
- We recently led two separate fish crib building and installing events and dropped 19 new fish cribs.
- The small creeks on the northside will likely be cleaned out this fall.
- Looking ahead We would love to commit some funds to a new trap above the Skid Row boat landing.
- We are supporting the Lake District in efforts to get a grant for river bank stabilization. We believe this needs to be done before installing a trap near Skid Row and getting that area cleaned out.
- We are constantly researching possible grant money to assist with future projects.

As we wrap up summer, I'm so thankful to all of our volunteers and folks that get involved in what is happening on our beautiful lake. We can't continue our great progress without you! New since 2019, the *Friends of Lake Eau Claire* Board of Directors voted to fund the show with <u>only those donations</u> <u>designated for this event</u>, with the hope that donations would drive a high-quality show with funds collected no later than December. *Friends* members did not disappoint! With a little over \$4,500, Pam and Todd Hanson, two *Friends* board members, went to work to secure a top-notch show.

This year's event featured a 35-minute non-stop blast of light, color and sound. Thanks to the extra donations (about \$1,400 more than last year) the show was one of the largest in years. Even the full moon came out early to watch. Whether you caught the show from your property, the road, or your boat, it was the perfect night to celebrate on our beautiful lake.

The hard work of planning next year's show has already begun. Much of that work centers on securing donations prior to December 2020 in order to place the appropriate order for our 2021 show. # Garbage, Yard Waste and Recycling! Oh My!

The natural beauty of Lake Eau Claire and the surrounding county forest offers a great benefit, and most do their part to help preserve that beauty. However, illegal dumping on county forest land, including sediment deposit sites of yard waste, furniture, automobile waste, electronics and construction debris continues to be a challenge.

It may not seem like dumping one small pile of garden waste or brush along a road or in the county forest would have much of an impact, but others see this and sometimes start adding to the pile. Soon it becomes a common dump site full of debris that can harm wildlife and domestic animals, and mars the natural beauty of the area. Eventually this garbage must be picked up and properly disposed of, which results in all of us paying the bill.

If you observe a problem, please speak up. To report a problem, you can contact the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource hotline at 1-800-TIP-WDNR (1-800-847-9367) or the County Sherriff's Office non-emergency telephone number at 715-839-4972. If caught, fines range from \$263. 50 for a small amount of garbage to \$767.50 for larger items such as tires, furniture, and construction waste. Additionally, violators are required to remove the waste from the area at their own expense.

The Town of Bridge Creek Recycling Center on Highway 27 just a few miles south of Lake Eau Claire accepts many forms of waste at little or no charge. They are open every Saturday from 8am-1pm, except holidays. They accept recyclables and yard waste for free; and tires, appliances, electronics, and non-recycling garbage for a modest fee. You can see their most up to date information on their Facebook page. The staff is friendly and helpful and can direct you to the most appropriate disposal option if what you have to discard is not accepted there.



Let's all do our part to keep our neighborhood and the surrounding green space beautiful.

# **Corporate Giving Programs**



Did you know that many corporations have formal Corporate Giving Programs?

Here the top four most prevalent types of corporate giving programs:

## 1. Community Grants

Most large corporations have either created a foundation to handle their charitable giving programs or handle them internally. Through community grant programs, companies are able to support the needs of their local communities.

## 2. Employee Volunteer Grants

These are grants that individual employees earn for a nonprofit after meeting certain volunteer thresholds. For instance, one company awards \$150 grants for every 10 hours that employees volunteer. In many cases, companies also offer programs where they recognize a few employees each year who really exemplify

corporate volunteerism and award larger grants in the range of \$5,000 - \$15,000

to organizations where those employees volunteer.

### 3. Employee Matching Gifts

Corporate matching gift programs are charitable giving programs created by corporations in which the company matches donations made by employees to eligible nonprofit organizations. *For instance, American Family Insurance will match an employee's charitable donations, up to a certain amount.* 

#### 4. Corporate Sponsorships

Corporate sponsorships are a form of advertising in which companies pay to be associated with certain events or attractions.

If you haven't already done so, see if your employer has a Corporate Giving Program that you can take advantage of!

# Home Winterization CHECKLIST

# BE PREPARED

- · Buy a snow shovel now so you'll have it before winter weather hits.
- · Keep extra water and canned food in storage just in case.

# **GUTTERS & DOWNSPOUTS**

- Clean gutters and downspouts in mid-fall and double-check them before winter.
- Install leaf guards to keep falling leaves and other debris out of cleared gutters.

# **DOORS & WINDOWS**

- Examine doors and windows for gaps where warm air can escape.
- Caulk or apply weatherstripping around problem draft areas.
- Install double-paned windows to increase energy efficiency.

# **HEATING SYSTEM**

- · Replace the filter in your furnace.
- Give your heating system a test run so you know it will work properly when you need it.
- Hire a heating/cooling expert to check your furnace's efficiency.

# **ROOFING, CHIMNEYS & DECKS**

- Have a contractor look for damaged roof shingles and loose gutters.
- Make sure chimneys and woodstoves are cleaned early in the season.
- Give your deck a fresh coat of sealer to protect it from the winter elements.
